

Centralia Fur and Hide's Dream Catcher Kit



Materials; 6" metal ring, ¼ by 64" deer lace, 12 ft. of sinew, One sewing needle, 3 beads, One feather



Take the leather lace and fold it in half, making a very small knot on the folded loop. If the knot is too large you will run out of lace at the end of the ring.



Begin wrapping one side of the leather lace tightly down the ring without overlapping the lace. Continue until the 1st piece of lace is parallel with the 1st knot. Repeat with the remaining piece of lace on the other side



Tie the leather lace together at the bottom. They will make two laces too put your beads and Feather on in the last step



Take the sinew and tie a knot one inch away from the bottom knot.



With the loose end of sinew going clockwise, tie a loop knot. Keep the knots two inches away from each other and repeat until you have finished going around the ring. You can use the needle to thread the sinew with ease,



When weaving the 2nd layer, continue the same process as the step prior. Make sure the knots are at the center of the previous knots.

Before finishing tying the web add one bead to simulate the spider.



Repeat the steps until you are left with a penny size circle.

When finished, tie one last knot and pull the sinew tight.

Then cut the remainder sinew off.



Finish by adding feathers and the beads to the leather laces that you tied together as seen in the last picture.

You might need to tie a knot to keep the beads on. And a little bit of glue to hold the feather or you can use the leftover sinew to tie the feather on.
